

## Applying for exchange at ANU



If you are a current university student overseas and your home university is one of our exchange partners then you may apply to study as an exchange student. Partner agreements simplify the exchange procedures for you, and tuition fees continue to be paid to your home university as though you are continuing study there.

Exchange students must meet the following criteria.

- Approval and nomination to study at ANU by their home university.
- Meet the ANU English language requirements.

### Step 1

#### Before applying

Talk to the exchange office at your home university about the requirements for taking part in our exchange or study abroad program, and confirm that your home university has a general or college specific exchange agreement with ANU.

Be sure to allow plenty of time to meet all the necessary deadlines at your home university.

### Step 2

#### Start your online application

Apply online using the online application manager by the relevant semester's application deadline. Late applications will not be accepted.

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Students applying must supply the following original or certified documentation, which can be uploaded during the online application process.

- Nomination letter from your home university approving your application.
- Academic transcript and current course enrolment (including translation if not in English).
- English language test results (TOEFL or IELTS) if applicable.
- Any other relevant documents.

## **Course specific requirements**

You must meet any specific requirements of the courses you apply for, including those below:

- Visual arts: You must submit a folio of 12-15 images (slides, photographs, CD/DVD, jpeg files, website, etc.) of current work from their home institution.
- Music: You must submit a high quality audio/video recording of themselves performing.
- Law: You must be pursuing a law degree at their home university leading to admission to practice.
- Business or economics: Applicants wishing to study a full-time load (24 units per semester) for must be studying these disciplines at their home university.
- Australian National Internships Program: You must submit an additional application and require a higher GPA as well as successful completion of two full years of study.

Receive your invitation

You will be invited by ANU to apply for your exchange before the application deadlines.

Complete your online application with supporting documents for a non-award exchange program at ANU

### **Step 6**

Make final arrangement

## **Fees**

Continue paying tuition to your home university.



## **Student visas**

If you accept the offer of a place and your enrolment is confirmed, you will then be able to apply for a student visa. All exchange and study abroad students must obtain an Australian non-award student visa (subclass 575) before arriving in Australia.

## **Overseas student health cover**

It is a condition of your student visa that you take out Overseas Student Health Cover. ANU will assist you in making this payment before a student visa is issued.

## Policy: English language admission requirements for students

### Purpose

To establish the minimum English language requirements for admission to the University.

### Overview

This document contains the requirements based on citizenship status, prior study, and English language tests. It also indicates requirements for conditional offers, package offers, and waivers.

### Scope

This Policy applies across the University.

### Policy Statement

1. This policy should be read in conjunction with the relevant legislation and academic eligibility requirements of ANU and applies to all programs.
2. University Rules relating to English language requirements can also be located at:
  - Coursework Awards Rules
  - Research Awards Rules
3. All applicants, whether domestic or international, for admission to any ANU program or course delivered either in Australia or overseas must provide evidence that their English language ability meets the minimum requirements for admission.
4. The most recent evidence will be used as proof of English language proficiency.
5. The University reserves the right to make any offer conditional on meeting English language requirements if subsequent evidence is provided that demonstrates that the applicant's English language ability is insufficient.
6. The University reserves the right to request that an applicant undergoes an English test in addition to any other evidence of English proficiency provided. Applicants may be deemed to have satisfied the University's English language requirements if they can provide evidence that they meet one of the following principles:

### Citizenship status

7. Citizens of the following countries who have undertaken secondary and/or tertiary study in English in the national education system (or equivalent) and/or at a recognised, local university in any of the Group A countries listed below:

- Australia



- Botswana
  - Canada (excluding Quebec)
  - Fiji
  - Ghana
  - Guyana
  - Ireland
  - Jamaica
  - Kenya
  - Lesotho
  - Liberia
  - New Zealand
  - Nigeria
  - Papua New Guinea
  - Singapore
  - Solomon Islands
  - South Africa
  - United Kingdom (including Northern Ireland)
  - United States of America
  - Samoa
  - Trinidad and Tobago
  - Zambia
  - Zimbabwe
8. These countries are determined by the ANU Coursework Admissions and Awards Committee.

### **Prior study**

9. Applicants to graduate programs with successful completion of 2 years full time or equivalent within the last 4 years in the medium of English where:
- a. Study is undertaken in the national education system (or equivalent) and/or at a recognised, local university in one of the Group A countries listed under point 7. OR
  - b. Where documentary evidence is presented confirming that assessment and examination was solely in English. Acceptable documentary evidence is outlined in point 12 below.
10. Time limits do not apply where the applicant has successfully completed (see point 11) an academic qualification completely taught and examined in English with subsequent predominate residence in a group A country. Evidence regarding the academic qualification must be provided as stipulated in point 12. Evidence of residence in a Group A country as listed in point 7 must also be presented.
11. Applicants to undergraduate programs may meet English language requirements by completion of an accepted Year 12 or equivalent qualification with required achievement levels. Required results and acceptable academic qualifications are listed in Table 4.
12. Successful completion is considered to be no less than 50 per cent of attempted courses in any semester in the assessable period (2 years full-time equivalent in the last 4).
13. Acceptable documentary evidence to prove prior study in English is a statement or certificate of confirmation, issued by the Registrar's Office (or equivalent) of the institution.



14. The statement or certificate must be on headed paper, and must be an original. Information included must be: Student Name, Degree Name and statement that the degree program was solely conducted and examined in English.
15. International applicants completing the ACT Year 12 Certificate from 2012 onwards will be required to achieve a result of at least 170 in English as a Second Language T major or any pass result in an English T major.

### English Language Tests

16. Successful performance in a single acceptable English language test taken within two years from the date of application will meet English language requirements.
17. Results from multiple tests cannot be combined to meet requirements.
18. ANU recognises a number of English language tests as meeting the University's English language requirements. Accepted English language tests, together with their minimum results needed for admission are represented in Table 1.

19. Students on development assistance scholarships such as AusAID, The Asian Development Bank or The World Bank enrolling in the Crawford School of Public Policy are required to meet standard English entry levels from 2015.

**Package offers**

- 20. International applicants require a minimum score to gain entry into the ANU College Foundation Studies Program as detailed in Table 2.
- 21. Applicants completing ANU College foundation studies with the required academic grade will meet the English Language Admission requirements for the ANU program they are admitted to.

22. International applicants require a minimum score to gain entry into the ANU Access English Program as detailed in Table 3.
23. ANU Access English will not be accepted for the purposes of meeting English Language admission requirements for ANU programs with an Academic IELTS overall score of more than 6.5 (or equivalent).

24. A packaged offer may be given if applicants have the academic qualifications required for entry but whose results do not meet the English language requirements. The applicant must be completing a program of a least 10 weeks duration at ANU College.
25. The package offer is valid for ANU College only and is subject to acceptance by ANU College. A package offer enables applicants to apply for a student visa for the duration of both the English language program and the ANU studies. For further information see <http://www.anucollege.edu.au/>
26. Subject to clause 23, applicants completing the ANU Access English Program with a result of 60 per cent, where the Access English Program was taken within two years of the date of application, will meet the English Language Admission Requirements of the University.

### Conditional Offers

27. Applicants who provide English test results that fail to meet the minimum standard required by the University, or who fail to provide any evidence of English language proficiency but meet the academic requirements of the program may be issued with a Conditional Offer of admission. This means that the applicant is not permitted to enrol in the program of study and will have their English language proficiency reassessed once evidence of proficiency has been provided by the applicant.
28. A full offer of admission will be issued only when English language proficiency requirements have been met.



29. There are no waivers of the application of this policy.
30. All applicants must meet the English Language requirements of the University as outlined in this policy or, in rare cases, by the relevant ANU College establishing equivalency on behalf of the applicant.

## Secondary Qualifications that meet the University's English Language Requirement for Undergraduate Admission

In addition to the English Tests and prior study outlined above, the ANU also accepts a number of academic qualifications as meeting the English language requirement for admission to undergraduate programs. These qualifications and results required, are listed in Table 4 and must have been completed no more than two years prior to the date of application.

32. Study abroad or exchange students can fulfil the University's English language entry requirements through the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages System (CEFR) by achieving a certificate of English language proficiency from their home institution with an overall grade of C1 ("Effective Operational Proficiency or advanced" according to the Common European Framework) with no less than C1 in each of reading, writing, speaking and listening. Study abroad or exchange applicants to the ANU College of Law must have an overall score of C2 with no less than C2 in each of reading and writing and no less than C1 in speaking and listening.

## DIBP Requirements

33. International applicants must satisfy the Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) English language requirements for visa applications in addition to University's requirements.
