

Japanese Language Course

Those who have no knowledge of Japanese should enroll in Basic Japanese. Those who have some prior exposure to Japanese should take the Japanese Placement Test, and they will be placed in the appropriate track and class level on the basis of their test performance. There are two tracks for the Japanese courses, the regular program and the intensive program.

Regular Japanese Course (4 credits)

The Japanese Language Regular Program is for a) newcomers to Japanese or b) intermediate-advanced level students who do not intend to take the Intensive Program. In the Japanese Language Regular Program, 90-minute classes are offered four or five times a week. Students take a placement test prior to course registration. English is occasionally used for instruction as necessary.

Intensive Japanese Course (8 credits)

In the JLIP, classes meet for three hours a day (9:15 to 12:30) from Monday through Friday. English is occasionally used for instruction as necessary. There are four levels, with the lowest level being for students who have attained level N5 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test or equivalent. All students who plan to take JLIP must take a language placement test prior to course registration, and will be assigned to a level on the basis of the results of the placement test.





(3) Official Academic Transcript(s)

★Applicants for the <u>UNDERGRADUATE</u> program:

The latest official transcript(s), showing courses taken and grades received, of all academic institutions attended should be submitted.

If applying for Spring Semester at Sophia, it is required to submit the transcript including the grades of previous Spring Semester.

If applying for Autumn Semester at Sophia, it is required to submit the transcript including the grades of previous Autumn Semester.

Student copies are NOT acceptable. Applicants must have the grades for at least one semester at their home institutions.

★Applicants for the <u>GRADUATE</u> program:

The latest official transcript(s) of all previous undergraduate and graduate studies should be submitted.

If applying for Spring Semester at Sophia, it is required to submit the transcript including the grades of pervious Spring Semester.

If applying for Autumn Semester at Sophia, it is required to submit the transcript including the grades of pervious Autumn Semester.

Student copies are NOT acceptable. Applicants must have the grades for at least one semester at their home institutions.

A certificate (certified copy of a diploma) showing that the applicant has finished the bachelor-level studies should also be submitted.

Notes:

- a. The applicants are expected to have a <u>Grade Point Average of B (3.0) or better</u> in the standard 4-level rating system (A, B, C, D) or equivalent for submitting their applications for the exchange program. An official transcript from our partner university is essential in submitting the application; an applicant therefore must have completed at least one semester of study at his/her home university as a degree-seeking student before submitting the exchange application.
- b. A list of courses that are in session at the time of application should be shown on the transcript(s) If not, please submit a separate list with courses in progress.
- c. The explanations of the grading system used at the applicant's home university should be attached to the

transcript(s) by the applicants' home institution.

(4) Two Letters of Recommendation (Form Provided)

The letters must be from professors/ lectures who have taught the applicant an academic course at his/her home institution.

(5) Photocopy of Passport (and visa, if not coming on student visa)

A photocopy of the pages of the applicant's passport showing the photograph, name, birth date, place of birth, number, citizenship, period of validity, and place of issuing. If the applicant is not coming on a student visa, the copy of the pages containing the relevant visa to enter and study in Japan should also be submitted.

(6) Housing Application Form (Form Provided)

ALL applicants must submit the housing application, regardless of whether they wish to make accommodation arrangements through Sophia.

If applicants wish to make the accommodation arrangement through Sophia, they must fill out all pages and sign the promise.

(7) Certificate of Health (Form Provided)

All applicants should submit the Certificate of Health completed within the previous 6 months, signed by a practicing physician and indicating that the applicant is physically fit to attend university and do the required academic work. All items (including x-ray) on the certificate must be filled out. *The applicants with special needs are requested to provide in advance concerning information.

(8) English Aptitude Proof

Applicants from non-English-speaking institutions applying to Sophia's English taught programs are required to submit one of the following English aptitude proofs:

- a. Minimum 79 TOEFL iBT
- b. Minimum 550 on TOEFL PBT/ ITP
- c. Minimum 6.0 on IELTS(Academic)
- d. Minimum 730 on TOEIC
- *Non-native English speakers who apply for **the Graduate Program in Global Studies** are expected to have a higher English ability in comparison to the undergraduate program. Applicants who cannot fulfill the language requirement will be denied the entrance into the program.
- a. Minimum 100 TOEFL iBT
- b. Minimum 600 on TOEFL PBT/ ITP

- c. Minimum 7.0 on IELTS(Academic)
- d. Minimum 870 on TOEIC

(9) Japanese Language Aptitude Proof (For undergraduate/graduate programs taught in Japanese ONLY)

For applicants whose native language is not Japanese, it is necessary to submit a copy of Japanese Language Proficiency Test N1 level certificate(日本語能力試験 N1) .

Some Japanese taught departments may accept students with JLPT N2 level or other certificates of your Japanese language skills. Please consult with the Center for Global Discovery if you wish to apply for programs taught in Japanese.
