A. **Academic Mobility Exchange for Undergraduate at Airlangga** (AMERTA) is an international program offered by Universitas Airlangga (Indonesia) for international students who interested in Indonesian studies through social, health and natural sciences.

- Program duration: 1 semester
- Commencement: Semester 1 will commence on 5 September 2016 until 14 January 2017.
- Opens for 35 international students.
- **Application is due for 15 June 2016.**
- Tuition fee WAIVED
- Partial scholarship is provided, total for IDR 6 million for 6 months
- Credit transferable: minimum 3 courses and a Bahasa Indonesia class

B. **Airlangga Summer Program** (ASP) is open for international students who are interested Indonesian traditional medicine or herbal medicine and Indonesian Language and Cultures.

- Program duration is 2 weeks, from 25 July to 5 August 2016.
- Opens for 40 international students
- **Application is due for 2 May 2016**
- Program Fee: USD 500/person
- FREE cultural trip to Bromo National Park
- Credit transferable: 8 credits in total
 - Indonesian Traditional Medicine : 4 credits
 - Indonesian Language and Culture : 4 credits

C. **Community Empowerment Program at Universitas Airlangga** (CERIA) is a community volunteering program from international students at a rural area in East Java Region. Designed to empower the society, It is intended for international students to learn and work hand-in-hand with the local students to empower disadvantaged societies.

- Program Duration: 3-4 weeks
- **The Program runs twice a year, for January and July Deployment**, also open for special session with minimum 20 participants
- **Application are due for every 1 November and 1 May**
- Credit transferable: 6 credits
- Program Fee: USD 300, which covers accommodation and meals

D. Tailor-made/customized program

We offer customized/tailor-made program based on your interest and need which can be accommodated by our faculties, such as Global Health Program with University of Rhodes Island, U.S. You can find the details of the program HERE.

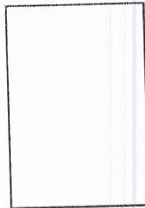

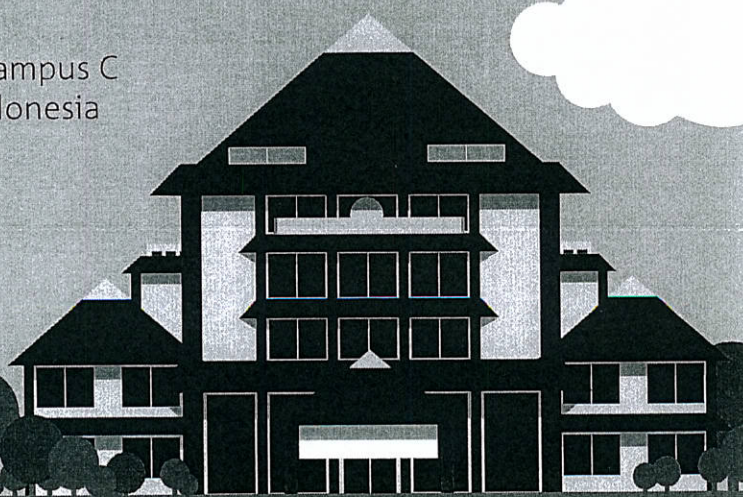

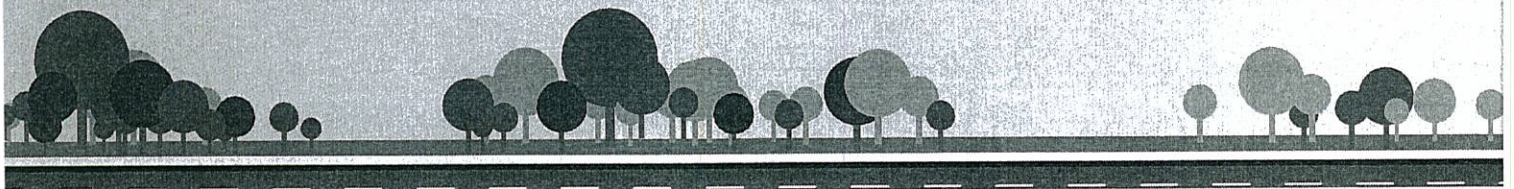

September 2016-January 2017

1. FAB401 Indonesian Traditional Medicine (Jamu)

Credit : 4 Units
**Lecturers : Prof. Dr. Mangestuti Agil, MS., Apt.,
Prof. Dr. Bambang Prajogo, MS., Apt,
Dr. Wiwied Ekasari, MS, Apt.**

Course Description :

The course is designed to give general and detail overview on Indonesian Traditional Medicine or Jamu. Topic of the course will include:

1. History, Basic concept of Indonesian Traditional Medicine, including specific concept of Javanese and Maduranese traditional medicine
2. Practice of Javanese traditional medicine
3. Practice of Maduranese traditional medicine
4. Indonesian traditional medicine for women's health
5. Aromatherapy in the practice of Indonesian Traditional Medicine
6. Recent development of Indonesian Traditional Medicine:
 1. Scientification of Indonesian Traditional Medicine
 2. Government regulation on Indonesian Traditional Medicine
 3. Application of Indonesian traditional medicine in primary health care services
 4. Improvement in the preparation of the medicine to improve their performance

There will be a field trip for students.

2. HKP100 Criminal Law

Credit : 4 Units
Lecturers : Riza Alifianto Kurniawan, S.H. MTCP

Course Description:

This subject is about principles, theories in criminal law and its development in recent situation. The content of criminal law subject is definition, principles of legality, criminal act and its element, types of criminal law, causality, criminal responsibility, excuse, attempt of crime, complicity, *concourses*, *recidivism*, punishment, and expire of crime.

3. EKT103 Islamic Economy

Credit : 6 Units
Lecturers : Dr. Raditya Sukmana, MA

Course Description:

Introduction to Islamic Economics is a course on foundation of Islamic economics which is based on the Islamic Worldview. Developing Islamic economic must be following method founded upon this worldview. This course covers Islamic worldview, Islamic economic methodology, Islamic economic system as well as Islamic banking and finance. Production,





consumption and distribution will be discussed from the Islamic perspective and compare it with their concept in the conventional economic literature. Other important part being discussed is on the Zakat as a pillar in Islamic Economics as well as the prohibition of Riba as stated in the Holy Qur'an. It is design to help students develop a basic understanding of Islamic Economic principles. It develops their Islamic Economic Literacy and teaches them how Islamic Economics relates to the everyday life of individual, businesses and society in general. This subject is held in classical/lecture method in 13 sessions, summarizing textbook task and papers task.

4. SOS352 Conflict Resolution

Credit : 6 Units
Lecturers : Novri Susan, Ph.D

Course Description:

This course is about understanding conflicts as an inherent phenomena in society. The content of the subject are models of conflicts and each of its solutions based on real conflict resolution experiences from all over the world.

Conflict is an inevitable phenomenon in the life of society. In fact, the conflict may cause a destruction of a society, if not handled well. This course discusses about the various models of conflict and offers a number of management or solution to the conflict that took place in the community. The experiences of conflict resolution in other parts of the world presented to give a number of examples of models of conflict management. This subject, no doubt, become very important with respect to the situation of the nation, both Indonesia and the world, which often takes place in social conflict.

5. HKD102 Customary/Indegeneous (Adat) Law

Credit : 4 Units
Lecturers : Joeni Arianto

Course Description:

This subject shares the knowledge and understanding of adat law as part of legal plurality in Indonesia and also as one of the most unique laws existing in the reality of Indonesian legal order. This subject aims to give an understanding to the students about the existence of adat law and its position and role in the Indonesian legal order, the existence of adat communities (Indonesian indigenous communities), and some important and interesting topics related with the existence of adat law and adat communities in Indonesia.

6. SJT307 Chinese Society Diaspora in Indonesia

Credit : 4 Units
Lecturers : Shinta Devi Ika Santhi Rahayu, S.S., M.A.

Course Description:

This course explains about the history of Chinese society in Indonesia including their arrival in Indonesia and their participation in Indonesian history. Moreover, it also discusses about the Chinese society and its influences on the Indonesian culture since the 13th century until the Early New Order.





7. HKN401 ASEAN: Organizational and Countries' Regulations

Credit : 4 Units
Lecturers : Koesrianti, Ph.D.

Course Description:

This course will discuss the outline of the legal system of the ASEAN countries based on each of the country's constitution. First, this course will discuss the historical background of colonial law in the ASEAN member countries followed by its development today. It also explains about the development of ASEAN at the beginning and its development to date which includes among others. The establishment of the ASEAN Community comprises three pillars namely ASEAN Security Community, ASEAN Economic Community, and ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community.

8. KME303 Epidemiology of Non-Communicable Disease

Credit : 4 Units
Lecturers : Dr. Santi Martini, dr, M.Kes.

Course Description:

This course discusses about the concept, the problem signification, and the prevention of disease caused by the metabolic disorders, allergic diseases/immunology, degenerative disease, teeth and mouth disease, mental illness, cancer, and current Non-Communicable Disease issues.

9. PSS402 Cross Cultural and Indigenous Psychology

Credit : 4 Units
Lecturers : Listyati Setyo Palupi, S.Psi., M.Dev.Pract.

Course Description:

Cross-cultural Psychology is the study of man, culture, and how they influence each other to be described as a dynamic in a society. In a literature mentioned that cross-cultural psychology is a critical and comparative study on the cultural effects on humans. As the field of comparative, Cross-cultural Psychology draws conclusions from the two examples that represent two or more cultural groups. This comparison requires a set of critical thinking skills. Application of Cross-cultural Psychology as a science, one of which is the research activity.

This course aims to provide an understanding of the notion of social behavior from the standpoint of both ethics and its *emik* culture. The course materials include emic concepts and ethical culture and gender, as well as cross- cultural research.

Upon completion of this topic, students are expected to (SLO): Able to understand the philosophy of cross-cultural and indigenous approach in psychology.

- Understand different themes in psychology from cross-cultural perspective, such as: personality, intelligence, gender, psychological development, motivation, organizational behavior.

Credit : 6 Units

Course Description:

Tropical countries have different characteristics of diseases from temperate ones. Indonesia, as one of the tropical countries is unique, having multi-ethnic population with variety of genetics and social-cultural characteristics and large areas, accompanied with variety of agents of diseases. In modern concept, the tropical medicine does not include only the emerging of the tropical diseases related to the interaction between host, agent and environment, but it has extended to the interaction between genetics, behavior, social-cultural and environment. The environment consists of micro environment inside of the host and macro environment outside of the host including climate and its impact. Although the tropical diseases have been predominated by infectious diseases, they include also non infectious diseases. Accordingly, to encounter tropical diseases should be done by genetics, behavior, social-cultural and environment approaches on the basis the triple principal factors (host-agent-environment) causing disease in humans.

This module is an integrated lecture, tutorial PBL, also field and laboratory practical.

20. PLL103 Oceanography

Course Description:

This course is designed to present an integrated overview of the principles and concepts of the geology, chemistry, physics, and biology of the oceans. The course begins with the explanation to the relationship between Oceanography and fisheries followed by the description on Indonesian water topography and division. 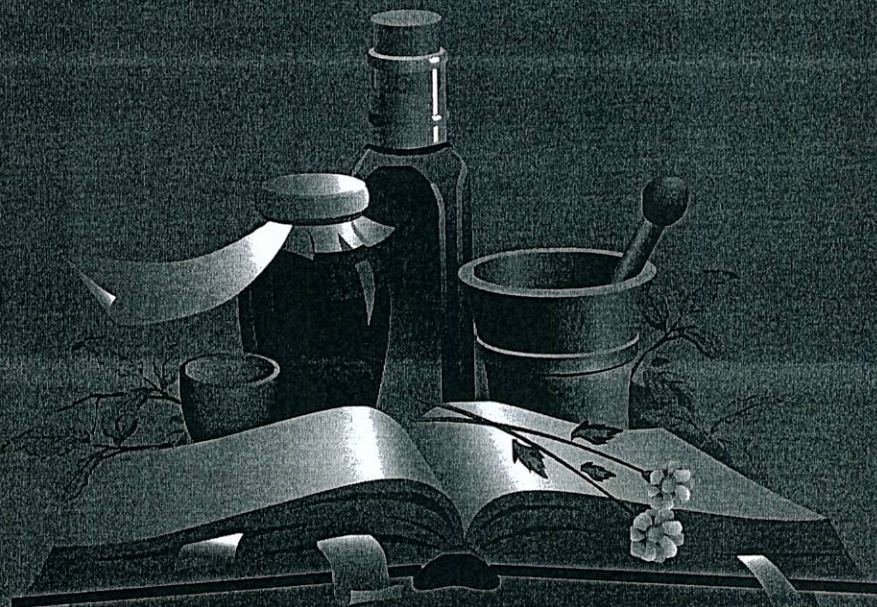

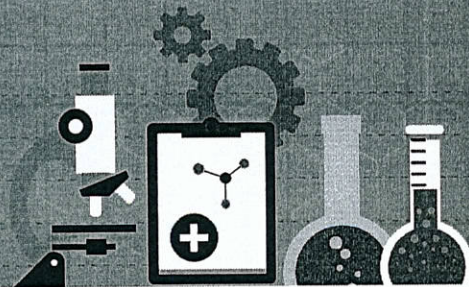

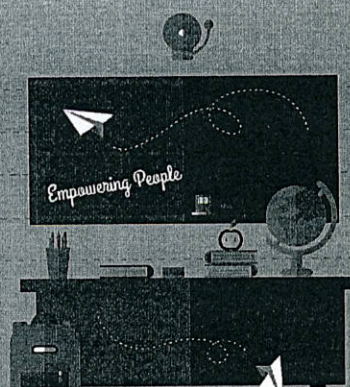


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About the Program
