Sophia AIMS Program (SAIMS) "Trans-Disciplinary Human Development Education Program Aiming for Harmonized Diversity" -Application for Spring / Autumn 2014 Entry-

1. Program Outline

The Sophia AIMS Program (SAIMS) is a trans-disciplinary program focused on "Iluman Dev lopment." Students from ASEAN and Japan will study together in a program that combines the disciplinary frameworks of natural sciences, social sciences, and hun anities.

"Hu nan Ecology: Diversity and Connectivity of Society and Nature" is the main theme, und r which students will select courses from the areas of "Engineering" and "Language & C. Iture," while taking one required course, "Introduction to Trans-Disciplinary Human Dev lopment (TDHD)." Students may also participate in the fieldwork seminar "Human Ecology: Rivers" and the Summer Session in Asian Studies offered in August.

2. Program Contents

Stuce ents will enroll as an exchange student at the Center for Global Discovery (Faculty of Fore gn Studies) and study for one semester at Sophia University. Students will take the following courses based on her/his learning agreement.

◆ Introduction to Trans-Disciplinary Human Development (TDHD) (2 credits, required for everyone):

This course provides students with an overview of TDHD, the core concept of the SAIMS program. In this course, professors from natural sciences, social sciences and umanities will share ideas about how each academic field approaches key issues in uman development such as education for sustainable development, the nvironment and development, aquatic ecosystems, environmental conservation, adigenous peoples and the environments, and food and agriculture. This course alfills the requirements of the SAIMS program.

♦ Fieldwork Seminar "Human Ecology: Rivers" (July 31 ~ August 13, 2014, 2 credits)

This two-week intensive course examines the environmental history and politics of Japan through a discussion-based seminar in Tokyo and hands-on fieldwork in Hokkaido, the most northern prefecture in Japan. In 2014, the seminar will focus on the ecological systems of the Kushiro river, the Kushiro marshland, and the Shiretoko peninsula (UNESCO World Heritage Site) in Eastern Hokkaido. Transportation and accommodation costs for the seminar will be provided by Sophia.

♦ Summer Session in Asian Studies (July 24 - August 15, 2014, 3-6 credits)

Since its foundation in 1961, Sophia University's Summer Session in Asian Studies has provided students with the opportunity to learn about traditional and contemporary Japan. Students can take courses of various topics raging from business to culture, politics to literature and history to society, and participate in cultural activities. Tuition for the summer session will be waived for AIMS students.



-Program Development Conference will be held every year to evaluate the program, joined by faculty members from Sophia and the partic pating universities in Southeast Asia (SEA).


